Teachers Trainings & Workshops

From Theory to Practice

ENGLISH CORE TRAINING FOR TEACHERS



A two-day workshop on English Core was organized by CBSE Ajmer on 28th and 29th April 2025 at GPS, Channi. The sessions, held from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, were conducted by eminent resource persons Ms. Leena Nair and Dr. Rajvi Desai. Our school was represented by Ms. Sindhu Stanley.

The workshop aimed to acquaint teachers with the four core skills of language learning—Listening, Speaking, Reading, and Writing (LSRW)—and to bring uniformity in the teaching of prose and poetry designed by CBSE. Several innovative strategies such as Experiential

Learning, Connection with a Direction Approach, and the idea that "Process is more important than the Product" were discussed. The resource persons emphasized the importance of integrating LSRW objectives into every classroom session and highlighted project ideas for the Assessment of Speaking and Listening (ASL).

The sessions also revisited formats of writing skills and facilitated detailed discussions on literature texts prescribed for classes XI and XII, ensuring consistency in pedagogy across schools. The workshop was highly interactive, with participants engaging in hands-on activities, group discussions, and demonstrations that enriched their classroom practices.

The learning outcomes were significant. Teachers developed greater confidence and proficiency in using language skills for both social and academic purposes. They also explored strategies for group discussions, interviews, oral presentations, and critical reading of texts. The sessions helped build communicative competence, reasoning ability, and inference skills—crucial for advanced language learning.

In conclusion, the workshop proved to be a **truly enriching and engaging experience**. It not only deepened the participants' understanding of effective language teaching but also equipped them with practical approaches to be implemented in classroom settings.

WORKSHOP ON CONFLICT RESOLUTION

IN-HOUSE TRAINING ON MS WORD & EXCEL



An in-house training session on *Hands-on Learning of MS Word and Excel* was organized by Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan's V.M. Public School on **25th April 2025** from 2:00 pm to 3:00 pm in the Computer Lab. The session was conducted by Ms. Sonal Sharma and attended by the senior staff members. SOFT SKILLS WORKSHOP FOR TEACHERS



A workshop on "Soft Skills" was held on 30th April 2025 in the Senior Section AV Room of Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan's V.M. Public School. The session was conducted by our esteemed Honorary Secretary, Ms. Kirti, and attended by teachers from the Pre-primary, Primary, and Secondary sections. The objective of the workshop was to highlight the importance of soft skills in personal development and in enhancing the teaching-learning process. It emphasized how qualities like empathy, communication, and emotional intelligence enrich classroom dynamics and contribute to professional growth.

The session was highly interactive and engaging. It began with an activity where teachers expressed their understanding of soft skills through words, drawings, and even short poems, bringing out values such as empathy, sympathy, and politeness. A group discussion on "Why are soft skills important for us?" followed, where teachers shared insights about personal growth, emotional management, and effective communication. Ms. Kirti stressed that soft skills foster happiness, tolerance, and problem-solving by transforming one's mindset.

In another activity, teachers read a short story and identified personal and professional skills within it, before reflecting on their own strengths and achievements—ranging from academic degrees to everyday milestones like successfully teaching a concept in class. She encouraged teachers to value even small daily accomplishments, as these contribute to overall well-being. The session also touched on the importance of guiding children to find joy in simple things, fostering contentment and resilience.
